The *Keynote* and *Pages* education I have received in the last two

meetings has been invaluable and has saved me a lot of time while adding to the professional look of my finished product. That is what OMUG is all about. I hope it is helping you as much as it is helping me. I have found *Keynote* to be very intuitive and by experimenting have learned things I do not remember hearing in the presentations. (With my memory that is a long way from saying they were not discussed.) I wanted to put a *Word* document in a slide and even after reading help, I didn't see how to do it. Then DUH! I created a text box on a blank slide copied the text on the *Word* doc and pasted it to the slide text box, resized the type and all was well.

I saved the presentations on a flash drive in ".key" format to show on my laptop. Then I remembered that our club's backup computer is a PC. I saved them on another flash drive as a PDF. I tried the PDF and it worked perfectly, just like Phil said it would. (I remembered that.)

The board has considered and passed a policy about using the club email list for solicitation. *The policy we adopted attempts to bridge these desires. It is:*

1. Emails sent to all members must be limited to OMUG-related matters; members can opt-out of mailings by notifying the membership chair in writing (email OK);
2. Members may publicize charitable and other non-profit activities by making flyers and notices available at OMUG meetings;
3. Members may post notices of charitable and other non-profit activities on the OMUG electronic bulletin board (*note*– bulletin board is not presently active but hopefully will be available in the future);
4. Members may submit advertisements for personally-owned computer-related items to the OMUG webmaster for posting on the "for sale or wanted" page (computer-related to include software, hardware, books, digital devices such as iPods, digital cameras, etc.);
5. Ads for commercial computer-related products may be submitted to the OMUG webmaster for posting on the website, subject to the requirement that OMUG members be offered a discount. Such ads must be approved by 2/3 of the OMUG board (This means 2/3 of the votes – not 2/3 of the total board – in case not all members are available to vote).

Questions about this may be referred to any officer or director.

I hope you are as pleased as I am with the impending move to a new location and time. I'm really looking forward to it. *First though, I'm looking forward to our November speaker. Ruth Williams will be speaking on "Desktop Management". I wonder if she covers physical desktops also. All my desktops need some management.* 🍁

## Apple Makes Big Financial & Product News.....

### **Apple's Most Profitable Quarter Ever**— edited from copy by Ed Shepard

Apple announced fourth-quarter profits that were simply stunning. Net quarterly profits were up more than 46 percent to \$1.67 billion, on revenue of \$9.87 billion.

Apple sold 3.05 million Macs (the most ever in a quarter) along with 7.4 million iPhones (up 7% from the year-ago quarter) and 10.2 million iPods. iPod sales were actually down 8 percent over the past year, but this was expected as people move from buying iPods to buying iPhones.

Numerous analysts and commentators joked that someone forgot to tell Apple about the recession.

"We are thrilled to have sold more Macs and iPhones than in any previous quarter," said Steve Jobs, Apple's CEO. "We've got a very strong lineup for the holiday season and some really great new products in the pipeline for 2010."

### **New Products and Upgrades**—

Long-anticipated new products from the Mothership were released on October 20th with a few surprises thrown in for good measure.

- All new 21 and 27-inch iMacs, featuring Intel Core Duo or **Quad Core** processors and much more.
- The White MacBook gains a unibody and a host of upgrades.
- Mac Mini faster and with hard drives up to 500GB, SuperDrive and more.
- The even mightier New Magic Mouse, Bluetooth and giving much of the same technology and navigating techniques that are found in the new laptops. **Watch a video about the Magic Mouse here.**
- Airport Extreme + Time Capsule base station updates giving up to 50% better Wi-Fi performance and 25% better range than the previous generation.
- Apple Remote gets a makeover

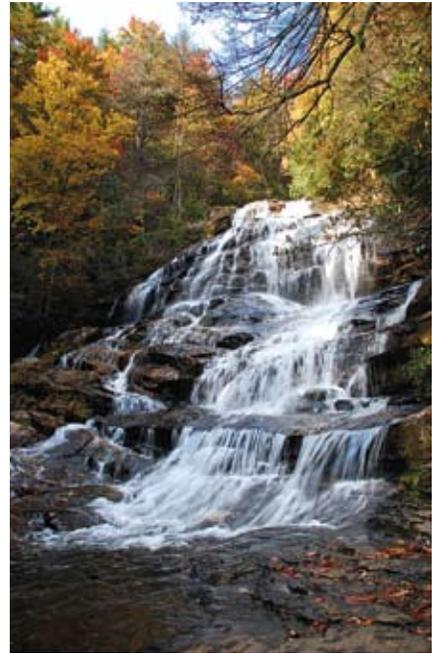

## Final Cut Express 4.....

**Upgrade your movie making and editing ability beyond iMovie—**

OMUG member Burt Stephens had been working with iMovie to edit old video footage so that it would be viewable and not totally boring for family and friends. This had worked but Burt found that he wanted to improve the quality by doing a more precise job. Enter Final Cut Express 4, a powerful Apple product that is a scaled-back version of its' Final Cut

Studio, much in the same fashion of Adobe's Photoshop Elements versus the full blown version of Photoshop. It gives you the power that you need to do most everything without being way more than you need. Burt reports that it is more difficult to use than iPhoto but he was able to find an excellent, no-cost tutorial available on the web. Go to <http://www.izzyvideo.com>. To quote Burt, "if you've considered going a bit upscale in making movies from your home videos, I recommend this product and the tutorial". The product is currently available new on amazon.com for about as low as \$165.

Here's a capsule commentary of what it does:

## RENAMER 4.0— Rename Files In Bulk



Ever been faced with a jillion photos transferred to your hard drive after a vacation that have names that mean absolutely nothing to you like “IMG\_3214.JPG”? There is an easy solution to renaming to something understandable. Software called **Renamer** by Dare To Be Creative, is a very useful batch file renaming application for Mac OS X. This latest update combines a fresh, modern look with powerful renaming options such as chains and a system menu plugin.

### Program features:

- Search and replace for text in filenames
- Insert, overwrite and remove characters from filenames

- Number files
- Convert between upper-, lower- and mixed case
- Group rename task into chains
- Rename directly from Finder with the system menu plugin
- Randomly rename files.

**Minimum Requirements:** Mac OS X Version 10.5 or higher \* Universal Binary for PowerPC and Intel.

**Renamer 4.0** is \$29 (USD), and available as a **free trial download** from the **Renamer** website. It runs initially in a 15-day trial mode with all features active. This is a paid upgrade for registered users.

## Apple **Quick Look** fans—Here it is!

**The first Quick Look Plugin geared specifically for photographers.** No longer do you have to import a picture into a photo application just to get detailed information about the shot. With *SneakPeek Photo* simply click on the unopened photo file (no matter where it is, even on your card reader) and hit the space bar. Up pops the picture into a large view that immediately gives you the detailed information you need. On the top bar, the much needed basics are there such as the type of file, its size, f-stop, focal length, color Sfile (sRGB, ProPhoto, etc) and even a mini histogram. But there's much more. Also on this view you'll see buttons at the upper right which ▶

will give you Exif data, all the camera settings, a Loupe View with high resolution zooms, and a large Histogram to see the blueprint of your shot. If the photo is geotagged, you'll not only see the coordinates, but a nifty map of where the picture was taken. Plus there's even a link to a more detailed map online.

**For a preview demo click here.** When the photo opens, roll your cursor over the icons/text at upper right of the window for detailed info.



The clear benefit to this plugin is time and convenience. "I really didn't like to have to open a photo application, wait for it to load all the libraries, then spend time once again finding the one picture I needed information about. So I created *SneakPeek Photo* to use as a bypass to all of that," says Code Line President/Developer Matheau Dakoske. Now, you can decide which pictures you want to download to your computer, without having to download them first. You can poke in and out of libraries and spot check shots without having to open and close applications. Want to check out a picture just sent to you in an email? *SneakPeek Photo* does that too and all in an instant. Compare photos at a glance to see which ones make the cut.

*SneakPeek Photo* gives you access to the kinds of information usually found in expensive photo applications. The plug-in requires Mac OS X Leopard or Snow Leopard. **A 15-day free trial is available** and the price to purchase is only \$10.00 if you like it.

#### Keychains & Password Reset

I am all about making computers work for their users. I maintain that while getting the most out of your Mac requires a bit of effort, it should be fun and not make you want to toss the thing out of the closest window.

That said, there are a couple of simple things that one can do to make managing your Mac easier. One of those things is understanding the way Keychains work. Keychain Access is the program that keeps your passwords saved so you're not prompted every time you access a secure resource like your email.

However, Keychains can be tricky unless you understand these features:

1. You create an administrative password when you first set up your Mac. That means you should either write it down in a safe place (you will need this password every so often), or make it blank (many computer users do not want or need to password protect their computers anyway; it's just a feature that newer operating systems have to keep your data safe). If you identify with the latter, leaving your password blank is a great option because there's nothing to remember.
2. If you do forget your password, it can be reset by using the disks that came with your computer. Instructions can be found here. However, when you restart you'll be plagued by constant requests to enter the login password. Keychain doesn't know that you've reset your administrator password, so it constantly asks for it. You'll need to delete the login keychain by selecting "Delete keychain login" from the file menu, and then clicking the "Delete References and Files" button.

One of the nice refinements in Snow Leopard is that on first restart after a password reset, Mac OS X will ask if you'd like to reset the keychains, negating the need to do so manually in Keychain Access.

**Program Topic:** Using Pages — **Speaker:** Phil Davis, OMUG vice president.

### Program Highlights:

- Phil demonstrated Pages 09 which is similar to Pages 08. (If you want people with Pages 08 to be able to read your presentation be sure to save it in Pages 08 format. You can also save documents in various other formats including Microsoft Word and PDF. • Pages is one portion of the iWork suite as is Keynote which Brian and Chuckie talked about last month. • A lot of the commands are similar so after you have learned one, the other is easy. • Pages can be used as a basic word processor or as a sophisticated page layout program. • Educational materials are available as tutorials on the Apple site, Books, and podcasts.

**Phil built a flier to advertise OMUG as his demonstration project.** • The text box, tool bar, format bar and inspector are your friends. Get to know them well. • Do not put two spaces between sentences and paragraphs. Use the Text inspector to determine precise spacing. It works much better. Text boxes may have columns which add to your formatting power. • Pages will save automatically, but it is still a good idea to save often. • Play with all the controls pages offers and you will find the ones that suit your needs. Some are so powerful they will surprise you.

- After you create your pages document you may save it as a pages document or export it as a word document or a PDF. If it is to be reviewed on a Mac or on regular PCs, PDF is the safest format to be used. Almost any computer can open a PDF file and have it retain the intended format. Al Sypher adds that the PDF option gives you three quality choices. If you are expecting the PDF to be printed commercially (as in a magazine or brochure) save it at BEST quality. If you expect it just to be viewed on Email save it at better or good quality and you will create a much smaller file with faster upload and download times.

- Avery Label Company sent us enough program DVDs containing their **design Pro** Software for MACs for us to give one to every member. They will also be available in November for members not present in October.

Judy Rankin lead us through a product description of the various things you can do with this program. *NOTE: you have to be at least at the TIGER level of OS X to use it.*
