

If you have been attending workshops and are on my mailing list, you must reply to an email that was sent this morning. I have had problems with Google so I am switching to a new system on my personal server.




What do you recommend? Reconfigure it, (and if so, could you demonstrate how?), or buy a better more secure router rather than continuing to use this rented one?


## Question 2




Bib Sur separates the system apps from data into separate volumes for security reasons. The **Macintosh HD** volume contains the protected system files and can't be accessed. The **mac hdd** volume contains all your applications, settings, pictures, and documents -- in other words, everything you can access with the Finder.

This is what my drive looks like when viewed with Disk Utility.



System = 15 GB



Data = 680 GB
